In 2017, she received an Honourable Mention of the International Fiscal Association for her doctoral thesis.

She has published several articles in top peer-reviewed international tax journals, including Intertax (Kluwer), the British Tax Review (BTR), the Florida Tax review as well as in other leading non-tax journals, such as the Journal of Environmental Law.

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
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
